New Brunswick is undergoing all the turmoil and excitement attending a General Election, which will take place on the 28th inst. The country, we learn, will be very quiet, and it remains to be seen whether the result will pass upon the Confederation Scheme.

We understand that the Deposits of the P. E. Island Savings Bank up to the 31st December, 1864, amounted to £1775 15s 7d. This is encouraging, as the Bank has been only about six months in operation.

We had the pleasure of seeing the "new notes of the Farmers' Bank in Rustico, in \$1, \$2 and \$5; they are very handsome, and we believe that the amount of the new issue will be calculated at \$1,000,000.

In our summary of European news today will be found the death of Sir A. Raperman, formerly Lieut. Governor of this Island. He died in London, G. B., from injuries received, and was in the 81st year of his age at the time of his death.

It is reported that a requisition to Judge Wilton to resign his seat on the Bench, and allow himself to be put in nomination as a Candidate for the representation of York County, is being vigorously opposed in Fredericton, and the adjacent districts. This is coming to the point. I wonder how His Honor will answer.

A New Town on the Atlantic Coast.—It is reported that the Confederates are improving the harbor of St. Marks on the western coast of Florida, in order to make it available for blockade runners. St. Marks is on the St. Marks river, and the support of Tallahassee, the capital of Florida, with which it is connected by a railroad twenty-six miles long. Vessels drawing eight feet water can enter the harbor.

The great importance of the port of Wilmington to the Confederates is so well known, that from the statement of a Richmond journal that from Oct. 25, 1864, to the end of the year, the following articles, with others, were imported into Wilmington:—8,635,000 pounds of meat, 1,307,000 pounds of lead, 1,500,000 pounds of saltpetre, 60,000 rifles, and 564,000 pairs of shoes.

The city of Montreal has 1164 houses, from the census taken in the month of May, 1864, of which 600,000 were in the city, and 564,000 in the suburbs.
