

The London correspondent of the Montreal Gazette has the following remarks, touching the matter of dispute between the British and American Governments—

The French newspapers since there has been difficulty between Sir F. Bruce and President Johnson, and the use of 95,000 men about the Confederate refugees in Canada, the latter being some wholesale "extradition" (extrusion, we suppose) the course dictating the conduct of the Governor General in refusing it.

The article in the *Out*, which has created so much talk, advocates an understanding between England and France, so that if either is attacked in the name of the Monroe doctrine, the other will make common cause. This is the only convincing argument for use with American statesmen, it thinks, and that their practical common sense will recoil from the dangers with which their country would be menaced by the combination of the two greatest naval and military Powers of the world, whose alliance, official and hands-off, would be the best security to the welfare of mankind.

TREATMENT OF AMERICAN SHIPS OF WAR.—A despatch from the Foreign Office, transmitted to the Admiralty, contains the following provisions, a modification of the regulations for the treatment of war vessels belonging to the belligerent States of North America which may arrive at ports in Her Majesty's dominions. The despatch states that the time has arrived for ceasing to enforce the restriction requiring the ships of either belligerent to proceed to sea after 24 hours' arrival in such ports.
