DEPORTED HINDUS FROM VANCOUVER

Federal Government Takes Action Five Thousand More Arranging to Come to B.C.

Vancouver, B. C., March 17--The Dominion government furnished a consolation to-day in the immigration situation and a testing of several of the regulations in the courts is likely to follow. One hundred and eighty-four Hindus who arrived from Hong Kong by the C.P.R. steamer Monte Carlo, and who have been in quarantine for two weeks, were at noon ordered to be deported to the Orient...

C.P.R. IS LIABLE TO FINE OF \$14,200.00

Empress of Japan Sailed With Only 35 of the 188 Hindus Ordered to be Deported--The Buffalo and Indian Specie Did Not Clear Ship.

Vancouver, B.C., March 18--Spicy developments in connection with the deportation of the Hindus who arrived on the steamer Monte Carlo and who were ordered to be deported to the Orient, were reported to-day by the Empress of Japan cleared for Yokohama with only thirty-five of the one hundred and eighty-three men ordered deported on board. The thirty-five are deported because they are either ill or penniless and no one attempted to keep them in the country...
