MRS. JOHN BOWRING.

At the advanced age of 77 years, the death occurred yesterday afternoon at Terra Nova, Sefton Park, Liverpool, England, of Mary, widow of the late John Bowring, after a brief illness of pneumonia. Deceased was a native of St. John's. She was the eldest daughter of the late W. F. Rennie and sister to Mrs. R. Harvey, Mrs. J. W. Withers, W. F. Rennie and W. H. Rennie, St. John's; John Bowring Rennie, Seattle, and Archibald Rennie, Quebec.

Miss Rennie was married to the late Mr. John Bowring, brother to Messrs. C. T. Edward and Henry Bowring and who established the firm of Bowring Brothers here and in fact throughout the Empire, in 1856. The issue of the marriage was Frederick, now Director of the Liverpool Branch; Hon. Edgar of the Newfoundland Branch; the late John and Edward; Henry in the firm branch in Liverpool, William and Arthur and three daughters, Lottie, Caroline and Louise.

For many years the late Mrs. Bowring resided in Liverpool and 27 years ago visited her native land when she remained a considerable time renewing acquaintances.

Despite her long absence from the home land deceased always took a deep interest in matters of local concern, while she was a particular friend to any Newfoundlanders who happened to visit Liverpool. She was a philanthropist and many institutions and individuals both here and abroad knew of her charity.

Though she had reached such a ripe age the passing of the old lady was wholly unexpected. To the bereaved members of the family and other relatives in Newfoundland and in the Old Country general and sincere sympathy will be expressed and in which the Telegram joins.
