#### A OUEER CHURCH CASE.

The Pulpit "Personalities" of a Bruce County Preacher.

A London Trouble in the Synod of Ham ilton and London.

Hamilton, April 18 .- The Presbyterian Synod of Hamilton and London concluded its business to-night. It was decided to meet next year at Woodstock in Knox Church.

The following gentlemen were welcomed to the synod: Rev. J. Van Wyke, Rev. F. Tapscott, Rev. John Morton, Rev. W. H. Vatson and Rev. W. H. Wade.

Rev. Dr. McMullen, convener of the committee on the licensing of students, reported recommending the synod to grant leave to the Presbytery of Hamilton to take on trial for license W. Cooper and G. A. Wilson, and to the Presbytery of Maitland for leave to take E. A. Mackenzie, B.A., on trial for license. The report was adopted.

The following standing committee were appointed: State of Religion-Rev. Messrs. W. G. Jordan (convener), Dr. McIntyre, G. C. Patterson, W. A. Cook and T. Nattress. ministers; Messrs. Harrison, St. Helens; Houston, Sarnia; Stevely, London, and

vener), Rev. C. Fletcher, Rev. R. Hamil-

ton, Rev. A. Tully, ministers; Messrs. Rutherford and Harrison, elders. The synod proceeded with the trial of the appeal of Rev. A. McKay, Lucknow, gainst the finding of the Presbytery of Maitland. The appeal book in the case covered seventeen closely printed pages. The charge filed by Rev. Mr. McKay alleged against the Presbytery the following offenses: 1. That it judged him without a trial. 2. Broke God's word as laid down in Romans, xiv., 4, 10, 13; I. Cor., and minister of the Gospel, and while sus-259 Dundas street. on matters of which he was innocent. The original complaint of the session of the Wingham congregation to the Maitland Presbytery stated among other things that Rev. A. McKay did on May 7, without any apparent provocation, it being the Lord's day, use the following language in his discourse on Hebrews xiii., 8, namely: 'There was a woman, a member of this congregation, who took offense at my explanation of a part of the second chapter of o'clock. Titus. She rose and left the church; as far as I know she has not entered since. She stated afterwards that the passage did not refer to the women of this time. I was urged by some of our people to go to her and apologize for what I had said and thus they tried to drag me in the dust, She dug a filthy hole and tried to pull me into it, but failed to do so, and fell into the filthy hole herself. A man, too, belonging to this congregation tried to make me a liar, but was caught in his own trap and was proved to be a liar himself, and yet when he visits the Sunday school his friends rally round him, asking him to lead in prayer and give him all the prominence they can." Further on the complaint says: "We believe such language from the pulpit on the Sabbath day to be unchristian and calculated to bring Presbyterianism into disrepute in the eyes of the world and to be especially detrimental to our interests as a congregation, both temporally and spiritually,

The party referred to got up and left the church, and subsequently her lawyer wrote Mr. McKay, threatening suit unless he apologized for his statement. The Pres-

bytery found against Rev. Mr. McKay, and he now appeals to the Synod. The appellant, who is a comparatively young man, addressed the synod at great ength, and went into such minute details of the case that it was with much difficulty that the average auditor could follow him. He received a patient hearing. "I was condemned on a mixed complaint," he said in the course of his remarks, "and there were 27 violations of the rules of the church court in doing so. It looked like a

I have made 13 references to the book of forms, I have referred to 33 passages of scripture and three clauses of church law as reasons for my course, but the Presbytery has not the ghost of the shade of the shadow of a reason." (Laughter.) He spoke for nearly two

hours. Mr. John Cameron, of London, suggested that the parties on the other side should be represented by one speaker, and condense their case as much as possible. "We are pretty well seized of this case in a certain sense," he said; "no one will be heard by this court more especially for their

Dr. Laidlaw brought forward an amendment modifying the finding. Finally it was agreed to appoint Rev. Dr. Laing, Rev. Dr. Fletcher, Rev. Dr. Laids

A committee was appointed with the delegates from Maitland Presbytery to confer with Mr McKay, to see if the case could not be settled. After being out two hours they returned and reported a settlement based on a finding that confirmed Mr. McKay's standing as a Christian man of character to Mr. Middleton when asked on the appellant should be deleted from for, and that in regard to the Christian | the Presbyterial records. The settlement was formally accepted by both sides, and a prayer of thanks was offered by the synod. Then Rev. Mr. McKay wished to reopen the matter on another count, but the moderator, on the point being raised by Dr. McMullan, ruled him out of order, and de-
