

# TRAIN RUNS AWAY

Fireman Fights to Subdue Him While Heavy Freight Goes at Terrific Speed.

Carnegie, Pa., Jan. 25.-With an enopen the throttle, and his fireman fighting desperately to get control and stop the runaway, a Pittsburg, Cin-cinnati and St. Louis freight train ran 30 miles today at a rate of 40 to 60 miles an hour. Expecting a wreck momentarily, the train crew clung to the cars unable to reach the engine.

While pulling his fast freight train out of Colliers, W. Va., this afternoon, Engineer Charles Kull became mad and fought with his fireman Perry Mc-Kinley, who struggled to subdue him and check the fearful speed which had been attained before McKinley discovered the condition of his engineer. The battle lasted almost the entire 30 miles between Colliers and this place, and both the engineer and fireman were exhausted when the train

was brought to a standstill here. Kull was turned over to Dr. R. L. Taylor, who examined him, and later had him confined in the West Pennsylvania Hospital, in Pittsburg, where morrow.

The ride shattered the nerves of all the trainmen. The forward brakeman tried to get to the engine when he saw speed that something was vrong, but could not stand on the running boards. As the train whizzed Burgettstown the operator telegraphed ahead to clear for a runa-


