HISTORY OF THE GREAT CONFLICT BETWEEN RUSSIA AND JAPAN 1904.

Feb. 8—Togo attacks Port Arthur.

Feb. 10—War declared by Czar. Japanese occupy Seoul, Korea.

Feb. 11—War declared by Mikado. Strict neutrality announced by United States.

March 4—Vladivostok bombarded by Kamlura.

April 13—Russian battleship Petropavlovsk sunk in sortie from Port Arthur. Admiral Maturov drowned.

May 1—Battle of the Yalu. Russians under Zusselitch defeated by the Japanese under Kuroki. Troops engaged on both sides, 15,000. Losses: Russians, 3,200; Japanese, 1,100.

May 11—Russians destroy and evacuate Dalny.

May 22—Battle of Nanshan Hill, first of the Port Arthur defenses. Russians defeated by Japanese under Oku. Troops engaged on both sides, 140,000. Russian losses, 1,700; Japanese losses, 3,500.

May 30—Japanese occupy Dalny.

June 14—Battle of Wokangko. Russians under Stackelberg defeated.

July 30—21—Battle of Haicheng. Russians abandoned the position on Aug. 2.

Aug. 14—Kamlura defeats Vladivostok squadron. Russian battleship Rurik sunk.

Aug. 19—24—First general assault on Port Arthur.
