## BRIAND'S COURAGE POSTPONES CRISIS

Fractious Ministers Stay When He Offers To Part From Them.

Associated Press Despatch. Paris, Dec. 29.—Premier Briand today advised a threatened cabinet crisis by publicly declaring that the resolution of radical ministers, who threatened to leave the government, would be postponed until the cabinet had adopted without dissent the financial plan which had been accepted "with regret but without despair."

His plain intimation that the departure of former Premier Herriot's friends would not be allowed to disrupt the cabinet, caused a sudden and complete transformation of the situation. The radicals accepted the financial minister's measures without a dissenting voice, and the decision to leave the government was postponed until the cabinet had adopted without dissent the financial plan which had been accepted "with regret but without despair."

The spirit of Locarno has been introduced into the cabinet," was the way Briand described his victory over the radical ministers after the meeting. There was a disposition in political circles, however, to regard the premier's success as temporary. The radical ministers, it was argued, in the lobbies of the chamber, had been out-generalled, but not subdued.

They preferred to remain in the cabinet rather than furnish a chance for the government to enlarge its majority in the chamber by putting representatives of other groups in their places.

The fight will begin again when the chamber meets after the holidays and will continue even if it is decided to form new groupings of the parties that will give the cabinet a stable majority, bent upon solving the difficulties of the hour without regard to party interests.

There are still many party leaders who consider this can be accomplished only after dissolution of the chamber and new elections.

Scientifically Applied Psychological Tests Advanced as Means to Efficiency.

Kansas City, Mo., Dec. 29.—Alluring vistas of happiness bestowed upon the human race and the scientist awarded his place among the "masters of the world" were revealed at a general session of the American Federation for the Advancement of Science convention here last night by Dr. J. McKen Cattell, retiring president.

With scientifically applied psychological tests, the speaker said, all persons which they could engage with the greatest efficiency and consequent happiness, while at the same time production could be more than doubled.

The address covered a wide range, including a fable of the popularity of psychoanalysis, which he termed "just a question of science as a matter of taste," a suggestion that tuition fees at universities be increased or lessened in proportion to student accomplishment, and a proposal for revision of the alphabet characters to make them more readable.
