

Improvements At Naval Yard

New Lookout Tower in Course of Erection at Esquimalt Station

More Wreckage From Unknown Schooner—Amur in Lynn Canal

The ship Bedford, which arrived a few days ago from London, commenced discharging her cargo of 500 tons of general naval stores at Esquimalt yesterday morning. Included amongst the freight consigned to the naval storekeeper and ordnance officer is 4,000 yards of electric cable, which is to be laid in the harbor at Esquimalt in connection with the look-out tower now being completed on the extreme point of the naval yard. This tower, which is built after the style of the high tower at Portsmouth, covers the harbor and the entrance to Esquimalt in connection with the various departments of the naval station. In fact, with every necessary office of the naval station. At the top of the tower is a large semaphore signal, which is operated by a lever in the room at the top tower, and a telephone will also be connected with the various stations of the yard. The Bedford also brought some improvements of the naval station. After discharging her cargo, the Bedford will come around to the outer wharf to unload her cargo for Victoria merchants, consisting of cement, lime and liquor, English groceries, cement, etc., and she will then proceed to Vancouver for which she has some other cargo, 11,000 cases of cement, consigned to Evans, Coleman & Evans. She has also 275 tons of cement for Seattle. Another steamer has been secured to bring a cargo of sugar from Java to the British Columbia refinery, and she will be followed by the steamship Queen Mary, which is about due at Java from Calcutta.
