A Scotch Baptist Church certainly was organized in the upper room in Colborne-street; but that church beginned defunct, some four or five years after its organization. The Leesting house in March-street subsequently was occupied for a time by the First Regular Baptist Church of Toronto and afterwards by the United Secsion Church (Presbyterian), of which the late Dr. Jennings was the minister. The Presbyterian congregation removing to another part of the city the meeting house became vacant till about the month of July, 1840, when it was re-opened under the ministry of the atte Rev. W. H. Cooms of Tauton, Eng., sent out to Toronto as a missionary by the English Baptist Missionary Society, and the present Jarvis-street Church was organized, supra, in October, 1840.




