TWO STEPS FORWARD.

The News-Record compliments the members of the School Board and Trustees for the marked improvements they adopted at their last meeting, namely, the abolition of promotion examinations and the decision to introduce a higher standard among its teaching staff.

Wherever fairly tried, the system of promoting pupils on their record for diligence, good conduct and attendance during the term instead of having them write on an examination at the end of a stated period, has proven a wise course. It does away with cramming, one of the greatest evils of our school systems; it raises the standard of the pupils' work during the whole term and the nervous pupil, who is studying and industrious, is pleased; it gives the teacher more scope for real teaching and the teacher, knowing through daily contact with the pupils, which of them merit promotion and which do not, decides the matter in the manner indicated. The Record believes this will work out and will prove a big step forward on the educational pathway.

The decision to employ the holder of a second-class certificate or better is also a wise step. The common practice among school boards where two or more teachers are employed, has been to get a cheap teacher for the lower grades as possible which is synonymous with getting teachers holding third-class certificates. The Berlin Board, having studied the matter, recognizes that the first few years of a child's life are more important than the last half dozen and believes a pupil during his first years at school should be under the care and tutelage of teachers who are as well qualified as those for the higher forms. The Board also recognizes that a teacher's abilities are not severely taxed in the lower forms as in the higher. In the latter more solid information is imparted to the classes than in the former, but it does not require so much patience and sustained effort. The Board also believes that all teachers outside of the principals should be on an equal footing in respect to salary and qualification, the teacher's standard should be raised too.

The result of the adoption of these two reforms mentioned will be felt. It will see better work done than has ever yet been accomplished, which is every one's good deal.

LETTER to the News-Record WANTS A BETTER SERVICE.

Mr. Editor.—At present one cannot pick up a city paper without having the enterprise of the G.T.R. paraded, as to their ability in carrying passengers throughout the province, applies to most competition points as well. With all this shanking up of "dry bones" we certainly had a right to expect a change from the stage coach service we are having from Toronto. But I have noticed no intimation of any changes for the better. Hager, I am told, now gets to Toronto mail about 0.45, via Hamilton and Harrisburg, while we get ours at eleven, though not much more than half the distance. As the last of the two night trains from Montreal reaches Toronto at 7.15 a.m. and leaves for Hamilton at 7.25 or 7.35, why should the train for Berlin not start until 8.30, 1-1/4 hours later? Speaking to one of the trainmen recently, he stated they could easily reduce the run to Berlin by 30 minutes, and with a little effort could cut it down to 45 minutes. Therefore, allowing 30 minutes at Toronto for transfers (instead of 10 or 20, as for Hamilton) and reducing the run by 45 minutes, we should have the mail at 9.30 instead of 11 a.m. These remarks apply equally to the night service, which mail should be distributed the same night. If there are any reasons but "pure business" for such a service, we should certainly be entitled to explanations as to the difference between Galt and Berlin, and many other points. Is the company's application of the monopoly they enjoy, such a measure of contempt that they will withhold all improvements in our service until we get competition? Had the Town Council insisted on running rights to all companies over the proposed spur line or a quicker mail service, would have been included in the change of time that have passed on in effect or which are still being considered. (Waiting to get relief now I think there are other ways by which we can get an improved service and it should be insisted upon by our Board of Trade that such is brought about.

Fin for Tampering with Ballots.
