What James J. Hill proved to be in the encouragement of the progressive agciculture in the west, George E. Graham, general manager of the Dominion Atlantic Railway, is proving to be for western Nova Scotia, for the competition was his conception, made possible by his enterprise, and he found able supporters in Professor Blair, of the Experimental Farm, Kentville, and Principal Cumming, of Truro.

Wednesday was given over to demonstration of tractors at work on the Experimental Farm. Potato diggers, manure spreaders and other laborsaving farm machinery was also in operation.

The threatening weather of the morning kept back many of the early visitors, who otherwise would have come to the Experimental farm, but several hundred had gathered by 11 o'clock to look over the labor-saving farm machinery on exhibition and to hear an address by the director of the farm, Proféssor W. Saxby Blair.

So interesting were some of Professor Blair's statements they could almost be classed as startling. For instance he showed to the visitors a forty-five acre field of turnips which had been planted since July 15 upon land from which a crop of clover varying from a ton and a half to three tons per acre had been already taken. These turnips had been planted for a special purpose. Next year seventyfive acres will be planted with the roots for the purpose of seed raising.
