THE CHARTER.

THE CHARTER.

The following are some of the powers conferred by the charter under the Great Seal of the Dominion of Canada:

(a) Acquiring a tract or tracts of land in the North West Territories of Canada, with a view of colonizing and sottling the same.

(b) With power of contract with the purchasers and settlers of the lands that intext cating liquors or alcoholic beverages shall not be manufactured or sold in the settlement (c) To purchase, take, lease, or otherwise acquire any real and personal property and any rights or privileges necessary or convenient for the Company in any part of Canada.

(d) To develope the resources of the lands ecquired by building, planting, clearing cultivating or otherwise dealing with the same.

(e) To aid, encourage and promote imalgration into the property of the Company, and to colonize the same, and for the purpose aforesaid to lend and grant any money.

(f) To aid by way of bonus or otherwise in the construction and maintenance of a line or lines of steamboats or barges from and through the lands of the Company to some point or place on or near and in connection with an existing or established lines of railway, and to make, provide and carry on, use and work trainways, telegraph lines, canals, reservoir; aqueducts, roads, streets, and other works which may be deemed expedient in promoting the objects of the Company.

(b) And for such purposes to have oil necessary powers for borrowing and investing moneys, selling and disposing of real and personal property of the Company.


