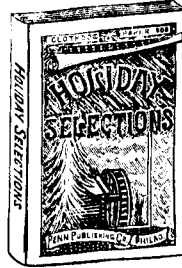

Holiday Selections for Readings and Recitations

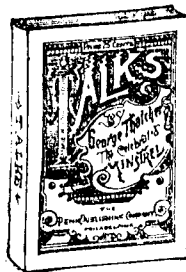

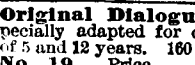
