

Bethlehem To-day

The traditional site of the birthplace of Christ, the stable of the inn, in which there was no room for Mary and Joseph, was enclosed by the Empress Helena, about A.D. 326, with a noble basilica, which still stands, surrounded by the three Convents, successively erected there by the Greek, Latin, and Armenian Churches. This pile of buildings is seen in this picture, from a copyright stereograph by Underwood and Underwood, New York, facing the Market at which the vendors of maize are pursuing their daily avocation.
