EXCHANGE OF NOTES (April 1 and 6, 1960) BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF
CANADA AND THE GOVERNMENT OF NORWAY RENEWING FOR A PERIOD
OF FOUR YEARS THE AIRCREW TRAINING AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE
TWO COUNTRIES

EXCELLENCY,

Following the termination of its NATO Air Training Programme, the Government of Canada has continued, as you know, to provide a limited amount of Canadian training for Norwegian aircrew students. This arrangement was the subject of an exchange of notes, dated April 17, 1957,⁽¹⁾ between our two Governments under which the Government of Canada undertook to make available annually training accommodation for sixty-five student pilots and five student navigators of the Royal Norwegian Air Force beginning with the quota year 1957-1958. The Norwegian Government for its part agreed to make a token payment of five thousand dollars per student pilot entrant and two thousand dollars per student navigator entrant while the arrangement was in force.

The agreement also provided that at some mutually convenient time during the third year thereof discussions would again take place on a bilateral basis on the need or otherwise of extending it for a further period. This matter has now been considered by the Canadian Government which is willing to extend the present agreement for a further four year period beginning July 1, 1960, and under the terms and conditions of the said agreement. The "Agreement between the Parties to the North Atlantic Treaty regarding the Status of their Forces", signed in London on June 19, 1951,⁽²⁾ shall continue to apply.

As requested by the Norwegian Government, aircrew training will be provided to thirty student pilots and three student navigators annually. The exact reporting date and size of each draft are to be the subject of agreement arrived at between the Norwegian Air Attache in Ottawa and the Director of Air Training of the Royal Canadian Air Force.

If the foregoing is acceptable to the Government of Norway, I propose that this Note and your reply to that effect shall constitute an agreement between our Governments to become effective on the date of your reply.
