

3. Agrarian Reform: Organizing and Management

- (a) Accepting agrarian reform as a developmental initiative
- (b) Peasant organizations must be given opportunities for participation at all levels of government.
- (c) Use of ODA funds - need for government organizing work. Support for training capacities for peasants to effectively engage with government. Governments should explore ways to manage ODA funds.
- (d) Peasant organizations must be given a leadership role in the agrarian sector to ensure that other sectors are not marginalized.
