DEATH OF AMBASSADOR CHARLES MARSHALL

The Right Honourable Joe Clark, Secretary of State for External Affairs, regrets to announce the death of Mr. Charles J. Marshall, Canadian Ambassador to Pakistan, in Islamabad on January 13, 1985, after a brief illness.

Mr. Marshall was born in Windsor, Ontario, on March 7, 1929. He received a B.A. (Hon.) degree from the University of British Columbia. He joined the Department of External Affairs in 1957 after serving with the Department of Northern Affairs and National Resources. He served abroad in Ankara, in the Disarmament Delegation in Geneva and as Minister-Counsellor and Deputy Permanent Representative to the North Atlantic Council in Brussels. In his most recent assignments in Headquarters, he was Director of Defence Relations Division and of Eastern European Division and later Director General of Information Bureau.

From 1977 to 1980, he served as Ambassador to Turkey. He was appointed Ambassador to Pakistan in September 1983.

Mr. Marshall is survived by his wife, the former Ann Clark, and by three children.
