(Private Bills)

The Bill No. S-16, An Act respecting Westcoast Transmission Company Limited, was considered in Committee of the Whole, reported without amendment, read the third time and passed.

The Bill No. SD-231, An Act for the relief of Kenneth Herbert Gregory, was considered in Committee of the Whole, reported without amendment, read the third time, on division, and passed.

Pursuant to an Order made August 26, 1958, a Message was sent to the Senate to return to that House the evidence taken and the papers produced in respect of the foregoing Divorce Bill before the Senate Standing Committee on Divorce.

The House resumed debate on the proposed motion of Mr. Rynard, seconded by Mr. Doucett,—That Bill No. S-15, An Act respecting Mid-Continent Pipelines Limited, be now read a second time.

After further debate, the question being put on the said motion, it was agreed to.
