#### CANADA MANPOWER TRAINING PROGRAM

Hon. Allan J. MacEachen (Minister of Manpower and Immigration): The Adult Occupational Training Act provides for occupational training which will increase an adult's earning capacity or his opportunities for employment. There is no specific provision for educational upgrading as such. However, the Act has been interpreted to allow educational upgrading which is a preparation for occupational training or which leads to employment.
