



Note.

The Elgin Association was incorporated by Act of Parliament 1816 August 25th, for the social and moral improvement of the colored population of Canada.

The settlement is nearly 6 miles long and 3 miles wide containing about 300 Families numbering about 1000 Souls.

The land is divided into Farms of 50 acres each and the houses built along the boundaries after a model 18 feet by 24 feet high, and set 30 feet from the road enclosed in front with a picket fence.
