## M'MULLEN FREED ON BOTH CHARGES

Jury Find That Ex-County Constable Did Not Commit Perjury or Forgery.

JUDGE'S SUMMING UP

His Honor Advises Jurors to Return Verdict of "Not Guilty."

After about ten minutes' consideration a jury before Judge Coatsworth, in the sessions court yesterday, returned a verdict freeing former County Constable James McMullen from a charge of forgery and perjury, which had been preferred against him at the conclusion of the Davis-Wettlaufer case about three weeks ago in the non-jury assizes court. It was charged that McMullen, who had been employed as a private detective on the case, wrote three letters, signing the name of Mrs. Wettlaufer.

Judge Coatsworth, when addressing the jury, said that he could not see how they could return any other verdict except that of "not guilty."

During his address he laid aside the

expert evidence concerning the hand-writing in the letters.

"He could have been justified in signing Mrs. Wettlaufer's name, on the ground that he had been communicated with by her to do what he could," said his honor. H. H. Dewart, K.C., counsel for the H. Tokio, May 19.—A plea to the press of the world to work for the removal of misunderstandings and suspicions between the nations was made today between the nations was made today by Premier Count Shigenobu Okuma in addressing a gathering of Japanese and foreign journalists.
