

THE HOUSE OF COMMONS OF CANADA.

BILL 20.

An Act respecting The Canadian Pacific Railway Company.

WHEREAS a petition has been presented praying that it be enacted as hereinafter set forth, and it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petition: Therefore His Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the *Canadian Pacific Railway Act, 1914*. Short title.

2. The Canadian Pacific Railway Company, hereinafter called "the Company", may lay out, construct and operate the following branch lines of railway, namely:— New lines authorized.

- (a) from a point on its Swift Current Southeasterly Branch in township 14, or 15, in a southwesterly direction to a point in township 8 or 9, range 17 or 18, west of the 3rd meridian, in the province of Saskatchewan;
- 15 (b) from a point on its Swift Current Southeasterly Branch in township 12 in a southerly and southwesterly direction to a point in township 9, range 16 or 17, west of the 3rd meridian, in the province of Saskatchewan.

3. The Company may within two years after the passing of this Act commence to construct any of the lines of railway which it was authorized to construct by section 2, paragraphs (a), (c), (d), (f) and (g) of chapter 78 of the statutes of 1912 and by section 1 of chapter 95 of the statutes of 1908 as amended by section 2 of chapter 81 of the statutes of 1910, and which it is authorized to construct by section 2 of this Act, and may, within five years after the passing of this Act, complete any of the said lines of railway; and if within the said periods respectively any such line is not so commenced or is not so completed and put in operation the powers of construction conferred upon the Company Time for construction.
