

THE SENATE OF CANADA

BILL U¹⁶.

An Act for the relief of John Tilga.

Preamble.

WHEREAS John Tilga, domiciled in Canada and residing at the city of Montreal, in the province of Quebec, mechanic, has by his petition alleged that on the thirtieth day of August, A.D. 1947, at Meerbeck, Germany, he and Isabella Maksa-Steinbergs, who was then of Meerbeck aforesaid, a spinster, were married; and whereas by his petition he has prayed that, because of her adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of his petition be granted: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada enacts as follows:—

Marriage dissolved.

1. The said marriage between John Tilga and Isabella Maksa-Steinbergs, his wife, is hereby dissolved, and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.

Right to marry again.

2. The said John Tilga may at any time hereafter marry any woman whom he might lawfully marry if the said marriage with the said Isabella Maksa-Steinbergs had not been solemnized.
