

146.—Being in Line, to Break from the Right (or Left) and March to the Left (or Right) in Column of Half Preceptories.

Column of Half Preceptories Break from the Right (or Left), Right (or Left) Half Preceptories—Forward.—On the word FORWARD, the movement is executed as explained in 143.

147.—Marching in Line to Reduce Front.

Where the obstacle to be passed is of such a nature that it is necessary to reduce the front, the front can be reduced to threes, squads, sections, etc., as previously explained.

If, however, the obstacle is of such a nature as to only permit a file or two's, the movement can be executed in this way.

148.—Advance in File from the Right (or Left).

Right (or Left) Turn, Left (or Right) Wheel, Quick March.—On the word TURN, the whole turn to their right (or left), and on the command left (or right) wheel, quick march, they step off, the leading file wheeling to the left, the remainder following in his footsteps.

1/2 Sa. On the Left (or Right) Form Preceptory.—On the word PRECEPTORY, the leading file marks time and the remainder making an incline form up on his left (or right).

Forward.—When the line is formed, the word FORWARD will be given.
