computed to consist of near half the Naval Force of France: To compleat their Series of Catastrophes, some of them were lost, and others taken in their Return Home; and another mischievous Effect of their Expedition was, that Mr. La Jonquiere, by his Presents of the Cloaths of the Seamen and Soldiers, who died on board his Ships of a contagious Distemper, to the Cape Sable Indians in the French Interest, communicated the Insection,

and destroy'd near two-thirds of them.

In the mean time Dispositions went on for preparing the Attempt against Crown Point, in forwarding which at Albany, supplying Necesfaries for the Southern Troops, and engaging the Indians of the Six Nations in it, the * Governor of New York had many Difficulties to struggle with, which he surmounted; and Preparations had proceeded fo far, that Battoes were provided for the Transportation of the Men, Artillery, and Stores across Lake Champlain; Ordnance Stores and Provisions were fent from Boston, and a Train of Artillery from New York to the Fort at Saratoga; and by the Middle of October 1 500 of the Massachusets Troops were upon their March from Albany to join those of the Southern Governments.

However, the general Alarm which had been occasioned by the Appearance of the French Armament upon the Coast of Nova Scotia had suspended the Prosecution of the
