The latter procedure, which is the one followed in the *Ontario Public School Grammar*, is no doubt the better, since it provides for an earlier introduction of the parts of speech, around which most of the pupil's grammatical knowledge must ultimately cluster. The following gives in outline the complete Course on the sentence and the parts of speech:

1. The Sentence
2. Classification of Sentences
3. Subject and Predicate
4. Bare Subject and Bare Predicate
5. Noun, Pronoun, and Verb
6. Complete and Incomplete Verbs
7. Objects, Completions, and Modifiers
8. Adjective and Adverb
9. Simple, Complex, and Compound Sentences
10. Subordinate Clauses and Phrases
11. Preposition and Conjunction.

13. The Exclamatory Sentence
14. Different grammatical Uses of the same word
15. Summary of the various Classes of words and word equivalents.
