

1731, and called FORT ST. FREDERICK. In 1759, it was taken by General AMHERST, and held by the English until 1775, when it was taken by Colonel WARNER—the same day that Colonel ALLEN took Ticonderoga.

This fortress was never entirely finished, though the English spent nearly ten millions upon it and its out-works. These works are much better preserved than those at Ticonderoga; among the spoils, at the time it was taken by Colonel WARNER, were a hundred and fourteen cannon, of which sixty-one only were fit for service.
