excellent breed for dairying. Good cows are possibly more common among Holsteins than among animals of any other breed. G. W. Clemons, St. George, Ont., is Secretary of the Canadian Association and in charge of the herd books.

Jersey.—This is one of the best breeds for purely better purposes. The home of the breed is in the Island of Jersey, one of the Channel Islands. The cows are rather small in size, weighing from 700 to 900 pounds, and do not, as a rule, give a large quantity of milk, although some individual cows are noted as heavy railkers. The milk is rich in fat, usually testing above 4.5 per cent., and the fat globules are large
