TO PUT TAX ON INCOME COMMISSION SUGGESTS

Up to \$500 Exempt and Graded Beyond—Bill for New York Legislature.

Amsterdam, N.Y., Jan. 10.—The special tax commission appointed by Governor Higgins last year, and of which former Senator Warner Miller is president, will meet in New York Saturday to complete its report, which is to be presented to the legislature Jan. 15.

The commission will recommend changes in relation to the tax on banks, railroads and corporations, as well as a general revision of the income tax. A majority of the members of the commission favor an income tax, and while several members of this character of opinion arising among the commissioners as to how the tax should be collected, as to administrative features.

HAMILTON HAPPENINGS

LADY TEACHERS WIN RAISE GENERAL BOOST IN WAGES

Cataract Power Company Granted Change of Venue—New Amusement Park.

Hamilton, Jan. 10.—(Special).—The lady teachers in the public schools got on the right side of the trustees this evening and had their salaries boosted. The minimum has been \$300 a year, and the maximum \$650. It took a teacher 17 years to reach the maximum. Under the new system the minimum will be \$350 with yearly increases of \$25 for two years, and then yearly increases of \$50 until \$750 is reached.

Lyman Lee and W. C. Morton were proposed to represent the board on the public library board, but the matter was laid over until the next meeting, as some of the members thought a trustee or an ex-trustee should be appointed.

Trustee Booker gave notice that he would move to have the teachers paid according to merit and he said an age limit would be proposed.

Trustee Woodell wanted to know if equities should not be made to find out if the government intended to make the kindergarten obligatory instead of optional. The board has a little over \$134,000 to spend this year and would up with a surplus of \$2320.

The Ingersoll Amusement Company of Pittsburg has secured 20 acres on the beach opposite Dunes and will spend \$250,000 on a summer park. Efforts will be made to have it ready by the coming season.

A change of venue in Findlay v. Cataract Power Company has been granted on the ground that the company cannot get a fair trial in Hamilton.

It is said that a big hotel will be erected on the property now occupied by warehouses at 18 and 24 East King-street.

No State. The Conservatives will not hold a caucus to settle the chairmanships in the council, but will take their chances in the council.

MODEL COUNTY BUILDINGS ARE OPENED AT COBOURG

Jail and House of Refuge for Northumberland and Durham Credit to Counties.

Cobourg, Jan. 10.—(Special).—The new jail building and house of refuge for the United Counties of Northumberland and Durham were formally opened here to-day.

The old court house and jail, originally erected in 1831, has been converted into a splendid house of refuge, costing \$30,000. It is located on a fine eminence a mile and a half northeast of the town.

The building was dedicated by Rev. W. T. Lewis, who read the Scripture lesson, and Andrew Quarrington, who invoked the divine benediction.

DEATH OF REV. J. H. MCCOLLUM

Rector Emeritus of St. Thomas' Died Suddenly on Wednesday.

With representative clergy of the diocese keeping solemn vigil, the remains of Rev. James H. McCollum, rector emeritus of St. Thomas' Church, Huron-street, reposed last night in the chancel of the edifice which he assumed charge when the parish was organized in 1874.

Death occurred suddenly on Wednesday from apoplexy at his residence, Albany-avenue. It is a tragic coincidence that just more than six months ago one of the assistant clergy of St. Thomas', Rev. E. L. King, also met death suddenly in the railway disaster at Salisbury, England.

Rev. Mr. McCollum was in his 81st year and was a native of County Cavan, Ireland. An honor graduate of Trinity College, Dublin, his first appointment was that of curate to Rev. George Gough Gubbins at Limerick, Ireland. For two years he preached in some of Great Britain's most important churches, traveling in the interests of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel. Coming to Toronto he was at one time assistant to Rev. Dr. Lett at St. George's, and later the first incumbent at St. Stephen's. After successive charges at Aurora and Burlington, he became the first rector of St. Thomas'.

The surviving family are two sons, James K. and Thomas E. of Toronto, and three daughters at home, Misses Alice, Dorothy, and Margaret. Mr. Matthews, M.A., principal of St. Alban's school, is a nephew.

The funeral will take place this afternoon from the church, on Huron-street, to St. James' Cemetery.

The service will be conducted at 3.30 by His Lordship Bishop Sweatman, and practically the whole of the clergy of the Diocese of Toronto will attend the service. The celebration of the Holy Eucharist, conducted by Fathers Emory, Sharp, Davenport and Bryant, will take place at 7.30 a.m.
