Board of Health Will Again Ask It—Elected New Chairman.

As was anticipated, E. H. Russell was on Thursday afternoon elected chairman of the board of health, following the resignation of Controller J. H. Saunders and J. B. Drake. Controller Saunders and his council members withdrew because of the office question raised as to holding an office outside of the council. The members who took the oath of office were J. H. Johnson and Hugh M. Douglas, who were present for the first time on Thursday.

Future of the utilities commission to respond to the request of Dr. H. W. Hill, medical officer of health, for the collection of the waterworks department, was reported. The M. O. H. declared traces of coliform bacilli had been again found in the city water, although it had later disappeared.

The recommendation for the chlorinating plants will be sent again to the commission as a result of the health department, through the construction of concrete water tanks, which will be built on the water works property.

The appointment of Miss Blanche D. Friend as public health nurse at a salary of \$1,200 a year was recommended to the council.

GROWTH THIS YEAR

Ontario Dept. Reports Most Favorable On Whole.

SPRING GRAINS GOOD

Fall Wheat Heading Out in Places, But Small Yield Predicted.

The following summary of reports made by agricultural representatives to the Ontario department of agriculture on June 10 is interesting.

The status of the corn crop in the Lake Erie counties is very favorable, and is considered to be very forward in growth. In the same district sugar beets and mangels have been advanced, and are receiving attention.

Spring grains never looked better at the end of the first week of June.

Live stock reports show that the market is beginning to head in some of the southwestern counties, but the yield will be small.

Clover is doing very well, and the prospects are good for a fairly full hay crop, but it is not yet a week earlier than commonly.

Summer and fall apples give promise of good yields, but the best of the crop have not yet set so well.

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
