PROTECTION OF TARIFFS

Evidence to Show That Tariff Reform Has Taken Firm Hold of England—Political Situation Explained.

NEW YORK, March 7.—(Special.)—The Tribune's London correspondent cables: The new president's reference to tariff revision passes here almost without observation.

There is the strongest prima facie evidence that the English people are ripe for a general revolt against free trade.

British Conservatives, having committed themselves to a definite policy, are not likely to be influenced by the scope or method of American tariff revision.

While there is nothing in the by-elections to encourage the ministers to appeal to the country, many Unionists assert that a general election will come in the course of a few months.

MEN OF WEALTH DANGER TO CHURCH

Rev. J. E. Starr Intimates the Source of the Teaching of the New Theology in the Local Methodist Pulpit.

A spirited attack on the course taken by the Ministerial Association to settle the Dr. Carman-Rev. Dr. Jackson controversy was made by Rev. J. E. Starr in the pulpit of Berkeley-street Methodist Church last night.

"But may a man not think for himself in the Methodist Church?" asked Rev. Mr. Starr. "May he not be himself a minister in the church?"

The speaker declared that the course was not fair play. He said that the onus of misrepresentation placed upon public or clerical authorities in the past was not fair.

"Back in that region is the bottom of the whole trouble," he continued. "Not that Dr. Jackson is a heretic, but that the idea ever struck him. But in sanctioning the arrangement for this pastorate, the Toronto Conference fell into the trap."
