"GUIDELINES ON CONFLICT OF INTEREST AND STANDARD OF CONDUCT"

Question No. 1,209—Mr. Beatty:

1. How many departments or agencies have printed material on conflict of interest similar to the booklet published by Statistics Canada entitled "Guidelines on Conflict of Interest and Standard of Conduct"?
2. In each case, on what date was the material printed and what is the government's policy concerning its distribution to employees?
3. In each case, from whom may a copy of the material be obtained?

Hon. Robert K. Andras (President of the Treasury Board): P.C. 1973-4065, December 18, 1973, contained guidelines to be observed by public servants concerning conflict of interest situations. Following promulgation of the guidelines, the Treasury Board issued a circular (No. 1973-183) drawing them to the attention of deputy heads and instructing deputy heads to apply the guidelines to their departmental operations. The guidelines were re-issued as part of the Personnel Management Manual in June, 1975. The guidelines may be obtained from the directors of personnel of government departments or from the personnel policy branch of the Treasury Board secretariat.
