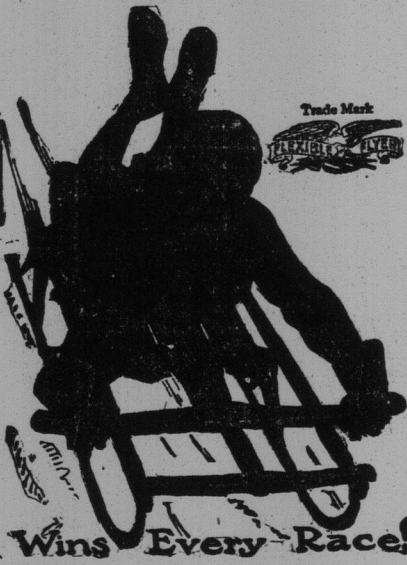

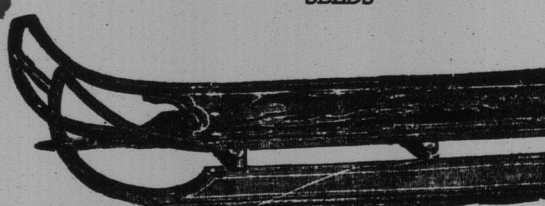

MORNING NEWS OVER THE WIRES

The American government has informed Germany anew of its deep concern over the deportation of Belgians from their own country by German military authorities. Germany has been informed that the treatment of the Belgians has made a very bad impression in the United States.

Frank Stanfield, Conservative M.P.P. for Colchester, N.S., has resigned his seat as a protest against a railway appointment at Truro. Mr. Stanfield favored J. D. McNutt, who is now chief train despatcher and had long service. The management, it is said, has appointed W. J. Mathison of the Grand Trunk Railway.

Convicted of the murder of Mrs. Hamilton of Hamilton last March, Mrs. Teenev Maloney was sentenced in Minnedosa, Man., yesterday by Justice Galt to be hanged on February 21.

The "Victors" of Laidlaw street Baptist Sunday school, at their mid-week meeting last evening took up second study in the life of St. Paul in connection with the Canadian standard efficiency programme under the direction of their class leader R. H. Parsons. The first test took the form of a debate on the subject, "Resolved, that the cow of greater benefit to man than the horse."

Ton Robinson ably piloted the destinies of the cow, his side putting up strong arguments. Hazen Fairweather and his team earnestly pleaded the merits of the horse. Rev. F. H. Wentworth acted very acceptably as judge and after due consideration awarded the debate to the affirmative, at the same time congratulating the boys on the excellent manner in which they had conducted their first debate. A hearty vote of thanks was extended to him for his assistance. The president, Oscar Reade, presided.

Vague Rumors Afloat About Spanish River

Montreal, Dec. 2.—Some days ago vague rumors were current in the street that some important announcement concerning the affairs of Spanish River Pulp and Paper was impending, but a leading official of the company when appealed to for some information replied that he had no idea what it could refer to.

Since then it's been learned that Toronto is the fountain source of the gossip, which relates vaguely to some sort of re-organization which would deal drastically with the \$8,000,000 common stock and advance the position as to resumption of dividends of the preferred.

The large amount of the common stock and its future status is, of course, an old story with the Street, but the sudden burst of prosperity for the paper trade rather overshadowed the talk of what might be necessary in that connection. Notwithstanding the improved position of the company arising from buoyant trade conditions, it will probably remain a matter of conjecture with the average man in the street as to the length of time which will be required to bring the preferred within reasonable distance of a resumption of dividends. As for the common, its outlook is vague in the extreme.

Provision for the accumulated bond in-

terest of two years and the retirement of the second mortgage debentures will be the first things to receive the attention of the management with the result that the market appears to have fully discounted the improvement in the outlook for the preferred unless some scheme is evolved which will advance it considerably ahead of present prospects.

How this could be done by using the axe on the common is hard to determine.
