## LAST MESSAGE

A message from the dead was concained on the centreboard of the little fishing boat in which Samuel Ferguson and Howard Galbraith of Lorneville went to their death in the Bay of Fundy last Friday. The boat was picked up yesterday by Bristoi Hargrove and Michael Murray, and on the centreboard in lead pencil was a final message traced with dying hands, "Our boat upset at four o'clock in the morning (Friday), and we were still in her at five o'clock in the afternoon. We are done for. Good-bye all." and the names of the two men to whom death was so near, were signed to their last, tragic greeting to the world about them.


They had been fishing off Musquash, but their boat was probably blown out to sea in the heavy gale and they must have had a nerve-racking, exhausting struggle for life throughout that whole day from four o'clock a. m. to five o'clock p. m. 
