L. W. SIMMS TO CONVENTION IN BIRMINGHAM

Douglas Breen Will Represent
Boys At Religious
Educational Gathering

U. S. PRESIDENT IS
TO BE A SPEAKER

Rev. and Mrs. Waldo C.
Machum Will Also
Attend

The quadrennial convention of the International Religious Education Council is to be held in Birmingham, Ala., from April 12 to 19, and will be a unique gathering in that it will be the first of its kind to be held on this continent with thirty-five demonstrations co-operating.

L. W. Simms, of Saint John, who is chairman of the Board of Trustees of the International organization, as well as chairman of the executive of the Maritime Religious Education Council, left last evening to attend the convention and was accompanied by Mrs. Simms. They expect to be away from the city for about two weeks.

The chief speaker at the convention will be President Coolidge, whose subject has not been announced, but who will address the gathering on April 15. Mr. Simms has the honor of being chosen to give an address on the same date as that on which President Coolidge will be heard.

Douglas Breen, of Brookville, will attend the convention as the representative of the Maritime Boys' Parliament, having been chosen at the meeting of the Parliament held in Sackville, in January. There is to be a boys' section of the convention attended by representatives of Boys' Parliaments from various parts of Canada and United States and the last three days of the convention will be devoted entirely to the young people's part of the program.

The C. S. E. T. boys in the Maritime Provinces are raising the funds to send Douglas Breen as their representative.

Rev. Waldo C. Machum, field secretary of the M. R. E. C., and Mrs. Machum, are also going to the convention and were to join Mr. and Mrs. Simms at Fredericton Junction.

THEME OF CONVENTION.

The general theme of the convention is "Building Together a Christian Citizenship" and many eminent speakers will be heard on various topics. The discussions are expected to be very helpful and practical.

It is of special interest to Saint John residents to know that Rev. Dr. P. H. Hayward, former pastor of the Fairville Baptist church, now directs the young people's work of the International Religious Education Council and under his leadership the work has been most successful. Rev. Dr. Hayward will lead the discussions.

CRIMSON TRAIL LEADS SLEUTHS TO EX-CONVICT

Robert O'Neill Taken On
Charge of Killing N. Y.
Policeman

IS WOUNDED BY
HIS OWN REVOLVER

Fight When Policeman Grips
Him For Hold-up of
Italians

NEW YORK, April 8.—Robert O'Neill, an ex-convict, is under arrest on a charge of killing Patrolman Charles H. Reilly, of the East 104th street station, who was slain, the police say, when he came upon O'Neill robbing four men in East 106th street, off Second avenue.

DETECTIVES SEARCH HOMES.

O'Neill, who is also known as Helin and lived with his wife under that name at 303 East Ninety-ninth street, was arrested after fifty detectives of the 3rd detective district, hastily summoned from their stations and homes by Captain Daniel A. Kerr, had searched every house in the vicinity.

They found a trail of blood which led first to the hallway of 327 East 106th street, where the police say they

found two revolvers, and then through the backyard across to the rear of 384 East 106th street and thence along First avenue to Yancere's apartment. There they found O'Neill in bed, semi-delirious, with the side of his leg ripped by a bullet. His clothes, heaped on the floor, were blood-stained.

The shooting of Reilly was first supposed to have been done by an assailant who fired at him from behind. Later four Italians told how they had come from the Northern Italian Social Club at 224 East 106th street, and had been held up by O'Neill. One of the four managed to fire and came upon Reilly at a nearby police telephone box.

When Reilly returned with the Italian, O'Neill is said to have confronted the policeman with two revolvers. Apparently the patrolman thought he could overpower the bandit without his

pistol, for he made no effort to draw his own weapon. In grappling with O'Neill, Reilly was shot four times and O'Neill accidentally shot himself in the leg.

Reilly was the father of three children, and was a member of the Police Honor Legion. Harlem business men called at the East 104th Street station and offered to contribute to a fund for the dead policeman's family.

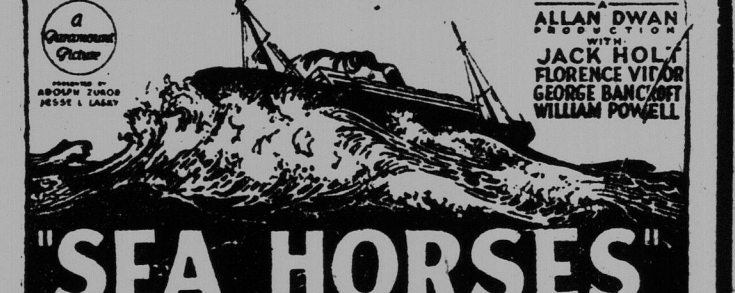
