RED CROSS DRIVE BEGINS OCT. 15

People Also Asked for More
Active Support of Nurs-
ing Work.

The New Brunswick Red Cross Society set Oct. 15 as a date to launch an intensive membership campaign at the concluding session of the special convention here yesterday afternoon. The public will be asked also to give more active support to public health nursing in order to prevent the infant mortality rate from rising again. Miss R. E. Hamilton, Dominion organizer for some nursing classes, spoke on the introduction of such classes in the province. There are now, she said, 253 classes in operation in Canada. Miss Hamilton expects to be in Canada about two months and will help in the work of organization.

Miss Harriet T. Melkejohn made a plea for a grant of \$2,500 to maintain the present nursing service. She outlined a scheme to finance nursing for 11 weeks in the province and this was discussed at length by members present.

Miss Jessie I. Lawson presented the report on the Junior Red Cross, and is elicited special commendation. The campaign for membership will be province-wide. Localities which decided to put on their drive on another date will be privileged to do so. Before adjourning, the meeting voted thanks for the hospitality of St. John members.

MINISTER IS INDUCTED AT ST. MATTHEW'S

The induction of Rev. J. W. Britain, new minister of St. Matthew's Presbyterian church, Douglas avenue, took place last evening in the church. Rev. W. M. Townsend, interim moderator and minister of St. Columba church, Fairville, conducted the devotional service. The induction ceremony followed with Rev. Mr. Townsend asking the required questions. Members of the Presbytery, Rev. McN. Matthews, Rev. W. J. Bevis, J. Hutchinson and the interim moderator then extended to Mr. Britain the right hand of fellowship.

The induction address was given by Rev. Mr. Matthews of the First Presbyterian church, West St. John. Rev. W. J. Bevis of Lorneville addressed the congregation. Rev. Mr. Townsend told of the call to Rev. Mr. Britain and of the latter's transfer from the Halifax Presbytery.

Rev. Mr. Britain was born near Glasgow, Scotland, and came to Canada when 10 years of age. He spent his boyhood in Pictou county, Nova Scotia. After a theological course in a Presbyterian college he engaged in evangelistic work for a time, finally coming from Elmsdale to St. John.

John Thornton and Mr. Hutchinson, representative of the Presbytery, conducted Rev. Mr. Britain to the door of the church, where he was welcomed by his congregation.

Miss Katie Fox, organist of the church, gave an organ prelude and presided at the organ during the singing of the hymns.

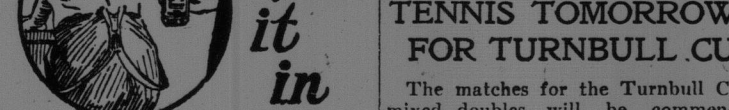
