MACKENZIE KING CLUB IS FORMED

Toronto Organization Sug- gests Similar Ones in Other Cities.

(Toronto Mail and Empire.) A Mackenzie King Liberal Club has blossomed out in Toronto. The event took place at a meeting in the rooms of the Central Liberal Association, when officers were elected and arrangements made to hold an initial banquet. The guests invited include the Premier-elect, Hon. W. S. Fielding, local Liberal mem- bers of the legislature, local Liberal can- didates in the recent federal election, and other prominent Toronto members of the party. Early in the New Year a mass meeting will be held in Massey Hall, which Hon. Mr. King and Hon. Mr. Fielding will be invited to address. The president of the club is Norman McEachern, the secretary, W. J. O'Reilly, and the treasurer Theodore E. Young. It was said that the organiza- tion would start with 2,000 members, these being the active workers in the re- cent campaign locally, and that it was expected to increase the enrolment to 10,000. The headquarters are at No. 1 College street.

Wires were sent out to secretaries of the various Liberal organizations throughout Canada asking that Mac- kenzie King Clubs be formed, with a view to a federation of all such clubs later.
