### OUR CATTLE IN ENGLAND.

London, May 18.—(Canadian Press).—Replying to a question in the House of Commons yesterday, Sir Arthur Griffith-Boscawen, minister of agriculture, said 31,974 live cattle for food had been imported by the United Kingdom from Canada in 1921 and 2,193 in the first four months of this year. No importation occurred in 1919 and 1920.
