HON. MR. TURGEON
ON THE TARIFF

Denounces Protection. Advocates
Farmers' Platform at
Regina Session.

Regina, Sask., Oct. 12.—Before the tariff
commission here in the capital of the
great free trade province, Hon. W. M. A.
Turgeon, attorney-general, a former New
Brunswick man, and Hon. George Lang-
ley, minister of municipal affairs, de-
nounced protection and advocated adop-
tion of the farmers' platform.

W. J. Orchard president of the politi-
cal section of the Saskatchewan Grain
Growers admitted that, like Attorney-
General Turgeon, he had not given any
study to comparative prices in Canada
and the United States. He would not
protect essentials of living, and also
would give but little to anything else.
He would collect our revenue by direct
taxation and produced some statistics to
show what a small percentage of the
revenue our farmers contributed under
this system. In 1918 there were in all
Canada 6,438 farmers whose total con-
tributions to the federal treasury by in-
come tax were \$402,570, while other
classes in Canada paid \$17,623,007.

Sir Henry Drayton declared that in-
come tax was not bearing very heavily
on agriculture, and would not be a very
fruitful source of all our revenue, al-
though the fairest in application.

IOWA FARMER BURNS
CORN IN LIEU OF COAL

Chicago, Oct. 12.—With soft coal at
\$22.50 a ton delivered at the farm, Iowa
farmers will use a large percentage of
this year's corn crop for fuel, declared
President Howard of the American
Farm Bureau Federation today. The
farmer receives net fifty-five cents a
bushel for his corn.

"A bushel of corn averages about sev-
enty pounds. The farmer receives about
fifty-five cents a bushel for his corn at
the elevator when freight charges and
other incidentals are deducted. This
brings the price of corn on the ear to
about \$15.75 a ton. Corn possesses the
same amount of heat units as coal. The
Iowa farmers have come to the conclu-
sion that it is much cheaper to burn their
corn instead of soft coal this winter."
