### WHOLESALE FALL WHEAT LOSSES

(Toronto Globe)

There are few sections in which the losses in fall wheat have been greater than they have in Ontario county. On the farm of R. J. Fleming, west of Whitby, consisting of 920 acres, 180 acres were sown to fall wheat last autumn. That wheat was put in under the direction of Thomas Underwood, one of the best cultivators in the province. Plenty of mechanical and horse-power was available for putting the land and good land it is, in the best of condition. Still there is not more than a quarter of an acre in fall wheat on the Fleming farm today.

On the smaller farms in Ontario county proportionate losses have been sustained. Mr. Tipper has had reports from different school sections touching on this. Here are specimen cases. In one section, on five neighboring farms, there were four fields of ten acres each and one of seven sown to fall wheat. There was a total of nearly fifty acres. There are only six and a quarter acres of fall wheat left in all. In one of the best sections five farms on which fall wheat was sown have none left. About forty per cent of the land sown to fall wheat is now in oats, the rest being divided between spring wheat, barley, mixed grain and corn.

225 Acres in Spring Wheat.

On the Fleming farm, when the extent of the loss in fall wheat became known, arrangements were made to put every available acre in spring wheat, and 225 acres were sown in all. There is one block of 112 acres that is a sight to gladden the beholder. This partly soil and partly on corn land, promises at least thirty-five bushels to the acre. It may go forty. Other fields, on pea land and summer fallow, may reach fifty bushels to the acre.

KHAKI GIRLS TO PULL FLAX IN ONTARIO

(Toronto Globe)

Four hundred girls bent on patriotic service are leaving Toronto this afternoon to pull flax at Dayton and other places in the neighborhood of Guelph. They will be away six weeks, moving on from place to place. The girls wear a khaki national service uniform with smocks, and riding breeches, and sombrero hat. They will live in military tents and provide their own camping equipment, groups of eight sharing sleeping accommodations and cooking arrangements.

Fourteen dollars an acre is paid for the work.

The flax is used in the wings of airplanes.

Mrs. William Galbraith has organized the expedition and the girls will leave in cars provided by Sir William McKensie.
