

Pine Forests Are Giving Out But Pulpwood Increasing in Value

(C. L. in Conservation.)

The important part that the crown timber lands of Ontario play in defraying the cost of civil government is indicated by the fact that during the year ended October 31, 1917, the forest revenue collected amounted to \$1,695,703. This is an increase of \$360,882 over the preceding year, and includes \$115,327 collected from limit holders as fire ranging dues.

The change which has taken place in this respect is strikingly indicated by the fact that, while the cut of white and red pine has steadily declined in Ontario, that of tie timber and pulpwood has increased greatly. 
