You may cut it on his card That a young man married Is a young man marred."

-Kipling. HERE is a very well known business man in this country-so well known that if I should name him you would instantly recognize him -who goes about preaching the doctrine that there is nothing in the world nampers a man's success like marriage.

His father, he says, would have been a successful capitalist instead of a poor man, if he hadn't gone and hampered himself by marrying. (Where he' would have been under these circumstances, this misogamist incidentally neglects to say.)

His favorite quotation is "He travels fastest who travels alone."

Now if this great man were the only man who felt and talked this way, no harm would be done.

HUNDRED THOUSAND CHILDREN TO BE THE **GUESTS OF KING GEORGE**


Queen Mary Joins Heartily in Pro-ject for Entertaining Little Ones at Crystal Palace Fete


