TO ESTABLISH HOSTEL FOR IMMIGRANT WOMEN

Support for the establishment of a Women's Hostel in St. John was pledged yesterday at a meeting under the auspices of the St. John Local Council of Women in the Red Triangle rooms, Mrs. E. Atherton Smith in the chair. The first steps will be the formation of a branch locally of the Canadian council of immigration of women for household service. A letter was read from F. W. Sumner, agent general for New Brunswick in England, dealing with the scheme of government aid in sending women to this province. The idea was further explained by Miss Lowe, who is visiting Canada in the interests of British women. She said many women in the old country were desirous of coming to Canada to enter into domestic service and thought that it would be a great advantage if they could be brought direct to situations.
