ON THE NORTH SHORE. OLD RECALLS MORE INTERESTING.

Two Ancient Settlers on the Peninsula Who Lived More than Two Centuries Ago. (Special Correspondence of The Gazette.)

The unfortunate custom which has prevailed in this province of naming our towns after places and noblemen is given Bathurst the name of an earl who never saw New Brunswick and who had particular command with the English in such names to our towns all that is ancient and characteristic in respect to them, are not particularly well known in respect to its early history.

The place has a history which extends back to the days of the English conquest, and which gives it some little importance more than two centuries ago. Before saying anything of this, however, it is necessary to describe the situation of Bathurst. The Bay Chaleur, that wonderful sheet of water which is covered and named by Jacques Cartier in 1534, extends southward from the main body of water into a deep indentation known as Népissigui Bay. At the southern extremity of this bay is the entrance to Bathurst harbor, a channel about half a mile in width between two capes named respectively Caron and Alston's point. The depth of the channel over the bar is only 12 feet at high water so that it is necessary for large vessels to load outside. The basin or harbor has an extreme length of about three miles and a width of about two and a half so that it comprises some six or seven square miles of water, but much of it is quite shallow. There is one small island, in the harbor near its eastern shore which is laid down on some of the maps as Gould's Island, which is known at the present day as Indian Island.

It has been generally believed that Bathurst harbor was one of the places which Jacques Cartier visited when he entered the Bay Chaleur in 1534. The theory has indeed been disputed by some recent writers, but to hold the contrary theory is to neglect the fact that Cartier, while exploring the Bay Chaleur westward by the North Shore of the bay and returned eastward by the same shore, a highly improbable supposition, the matter, however, is not of great importance for no doubt the fishermen had been in Bathurst harbor before Cartier's voyage. It is more important to know that Nicholas Denys, who was born in France in the year 1658, and came to Acadia with commander Isaac Delisle in 1682. It is worthy of note that Denys and Charlevoix, the life long enemy of Delisle, both came from France with De Rasilly and that Denys disliked Charlevoix almost as cordially as did Delisle.

Denys who was a man of influence, and possessed of some means, established a shop factory at Pointe-aux-Les, Liverpool, Nova Scotia. He afterwards established himself at St. Pierre, Cape Breton, but his first business was in the fisheries in 1684 and he was compelled to retire to what is now Bathurst harbor. He built a house and a rather inferior description of residence. I stood today on the site of Denys' fort, the land being a part of the Goswami property owned by the Ferguson family. Goswami, who was owned by the late Robert Ferguson, a brother of the late Francis Ferguson and Senator John Ferguson, was destroyed by fire this spring. It was a very old house, one of the oldest in Gloucester county, and was built by a man named Dumaresq seventy or eighty years ago, but the old house was modern compared with the residence of Denys, for the latter had been a ruin for more than a century before the first tree was cut for the Denys mansion. The Fergusones are now rebuilding their house on the site of the house that was burnt, and while digging a post hole the other day a few feet from their dining room window they made a very curious discovery. They unearthed the skull and part of the skeleton of one of the ancient inhabitants, evidently an Indian, for with him were buried three copper pots and a battle axe, after the manner of Indian burials. Possibly this Indian chief was a contemporary of Nicholas Denys and the fact that his grave was so near the Frenchman's fort goes to show that there was a close intimacy between the Indians and their white acquaintances.

The site of the fort of Nicholas Denys is now marked by a huge willow tree which is situated about three hundred yards south of the Goswami house. Here is the grave of the Frenchman, which is the site of one of the oldest establishments in Acadia, and here all remains of the headquarters of a government which extended from the eastern extremity of the Straits of Canso to the head of Bay Chaleur, for Denys held command, by authority of the king of France, of all that vast region. SECOND EDITION. CAREER OF CRIME.

HAINE'S JACKSHEEP-PAID IN LINES ONCE MORE.

Pierce at Mars Hill village, about twenty miles from here, had also been broken into, and the thieves frightened away before much booty was taken.
