### WOODSTOCK RECTOR CALLED TO STATES

Woodstock, N. B., Nov. 16.—The handsome three storey brick cased building, owned by A. E. Jones, under erection in Main street, south end of Meduxakik bridge, is nearing completion. Part of the ground floor is reserved and is occupied by E. J. Chinn, manager of the Unique Theatre; the remaining part on the ground floor will be rented by J. A. Vanwart as a furniture store. The second story is plastered and the carpenters are now at work in that part of the building which will be used by Carleton Lodge, F. and M. The estimated cost is \$8,000. The architect is A. W. Gay of St. John. The building has a concrete foundation which was laid by Steeves of Woodstock; the excavation work was done by A. Bragdon. The interior finish in charge of A. Stone, work is J. E. Wilson of St. John, while the general contractor is Henry Post of Woodstock, N. B.

### CANNOT SELL ICE CREAM ON SUNDAY IN CAPITAL

Supreme Court, in Fredericton Hands Down Decision in Case Affecting Washington's Restaurant.

Fredericton, Nov. 16.—A legal question of great importance and general interest not only to the people of Fredericton, but throughout the province, was decided yesterday by the full bench of the supreme court in their finding in the appeal of the case against E. S. Washington, proprietor of a local restaurant, Washington was convicted in the police court by Col. Marsh on the charge of selling ice cream and soft beer on Sunday under chapter 107 of the consolidated statutes. An appeal was taken by the defendant's counsel to Judge Barry, and he considered the question of such general importance that he referred the matter to the full court for advice. The argument being heard yesterday afternoon, A. J. Gregory, K. C., supported the appeal and argued that ice cream is a food and that the selling of ice cream was the supplying of a necessity, and that therefore came under the exception, City Clerk McCreedy, in support of the conviction, argued that the act was an extension of the law promoting morality and good health and each case should stand on its own merits. As to whether the act complained of was of necessity, a question of fact, the court rendered the decision at the conclusion of argument, instructing Judge Barry to confirm the conviction. There seemed little difference of opinion on the part of the judges, although Judge Barry apparently dissented. Chief Justice Barker, however, in giving the judgment of the court, spoke strongly, expressing the opinion that there was no more reason for a restaurant remaining open on Sunday than there was for a grocery store to do business on the Sabbath.
