STEAMERS COLLIDE.

Vineyard Haven, March 22.—Stmr City of Macon, New York for Boston was in collision with the Tarpaulin Cove last night with St. James S. Whitney, New York for Boston. The Macon arrived here at 8:45 this morning and anchored in harbor; she has a slight hole in side, which extends from upper deck five feet below water line; the Whitney has no damage. She arrived at Boston, the collision occurred during dense fog last night; the City of Macon was anchored and the Whitney groping through the fog crashed into her. No one was injured on either steamer. It is probable that the Macon will return to New York after patching hole in side.

NEW VESSEL'S MAIDEN TRIP.

The Carl Schurz, a new steamship which has just been added to its Atlantic service by the Hamburg-American line, left New York for the West Indies Saturday on her first voyage. She is a sister steamship to the Smil L. Boas, also new and which will begin her first voyage from this city on April 5. The two steamships are twin screw vessels and are each 409 feet long.

TO TAKE ORURO'S PLACE.
