## Water vs. Beer

Milk is wholesome and beneficial if pure—but is the milk you drink pure?

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Application must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within the limits of his homestead on a farm of at least 40 acres, on certain conditions. A homestead house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

Pre-emption—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead pre-emption extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained at \$2.00 per acre, on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Residence six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$200.

The area of cultivation is subject to regulation by the Dominion Lands Agency. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.
