Sir Thomas White Shows Pictou Grit Th Will Not Suffer Undue Hardship Mining Men Themselves Have O if More Revenue Needed Than Tax

Ottawa, March 17.—Sir Thomas in the world white's business tax resolutions were taken up in committee when the House assembled and Mr. MacDonald of Pictou spoke of the effect of the taxation upon mining companies. The member for Pictou feared that the legislation would have the effect of preventing the consummation of proposals already made for the capitalization of corporations for the development of mining properties. He also predicted that foreign capitalists would not invest their money in mining enterprises in a country where they could only make seven per cent.
