

## BONDSMAN MADE DELIVERY OF AN INNOCENT WOMAN

Bertha Zelinsky Held as Vera Bonowski—In Jail Three Days

COULD NOT UNDERSTAND WHY SHE WAS THERE

Complainants and Detective Who Made Arrest Prove the Mistake

New York, May 27.—Jacob Raikes of 10 Greenpoint avenue, Long Island city, went to Reading, Pa., last Saturday and came back to New York with Mrs. Bertha Zelinsky, her month-old child and her three-year-old daughter, and delivered the woman to the warden of the Queens County Jail as Vera Bonowski, on whose bond he went in May, 1920, after she had been accused of stealing household goods from Henry Goldstein of 1090 Gibson place, Far Rockaway.

Ordered Released. Late yesterday afternoon the woman was arraigned before Judge Humphrey in Queens County court and released after it developed that she was not the Bonowski woman. Mrs. Zelinsky had no money whatever when released, but was taken up by Attorney Wm. J. Creamer, and she was sent home. She had been held for three days, however, without warrant of law.

Bonowski woman was a servant employed in the Goldstein home in 1920 and was charged with stealing household goods valued at more than \$800. While she was in the Queens County Jail waiting for her case to be tried she was released on \$1,000 bail furnished by Raikes. Later an indictment was returned against her, and last week Raikes was ordered by the District Attorney to produce the defendant for trial. Raikes told the court yesterday that when he received this notice he called on the woman's sister and he said that the Bonowski woman was at 412 Maxner street, Hoboken. He says he went to that address and Mrs. Zelinsky, recognized her as Vera Bonowski and immediately brought her to New York.

No Retribution to Other. Mrs. Zelinsky was proved by the District Attorney not to be the defendant. She made no complaint when she was first put in jail, but Monday morning she told the matron that she did not know why she had been arrested, but the man who had brought her to New York to see her sister and that he would pay her \$10,000. Mr. and Mrs. Goldstein and Detective Raymond, who arrested the former Goldstein servant, looked at Mrs. Zelinsky and said she bore no resemblance to the Bonowski woman.
